Imagine yourself surrounded by kangaroos and wallabies, and being in awe at an echidna digging for ants. You may hear a squawking noise, look up and see a rare glossy black cockatoo flying in the sky. With a bit of luck, you could spot a White-bellied Sea Eagle gliding above the water, or perched on the Cape St Albans lighthouse, keeping watch. Take time to enjoy the stunning sunset over Kona Beach and Antechamber Bay with views to the mainland.

ENGAGE YOUR SENSES

Listen for the sounds of rustling leaves or animal calls. As the sun shifts toward the horizon, Tammar wallabies and kangaroos move from their daytime shelter of bushland to grassy areas to feed.

Once it has gone dark, make your way back to your CABN X, lay back on your Glamswag and enjoy the spectacular views of the Great Southern Skies which offer a unique perspective on the cosmos. The Southern Cross, a constellation and important symbol in Australian culture, is made up of four bright stars that form a cross shape and can be used to help navigate in the Southern Hemisphere. On a clear night you will also see Orion, Scorpius, Taurus, and the Milky Way!
