Dining 'local'

Penneshaw is less than a 30 minute drive from Cape St Albans and has several options for both lunch and dinner. Below are a few of our local faves - including one 'just around the corner' from Cape St Albans.

Millie Mae's Pantry

For beautiful coffee, fresh healthy lunch or a friendly afternoon local wine, gin or beer with a sweet or savoury snack, visit Millie Mae's Pantry in the heart of Penneshaw. You can also find a wide range of Kangaroo Island made products, onsite pantry and picnic options including mixed wraps, paninis and sweet treats.

The hotel also includes a bottle shop for you to purchase and takeaway your beverage of choice.

In-room dining:

Let someone else do the hard work - a pre-planned and chef prepared hamper includes two dinners and desserts that requires minimal preparation or reheating.

We partner with Kangaroo Island Source to showcase the finest Kangaroo Island produce. Examples of menu items are below, with more detail available on the order form.

'From the Land' - Lamb cutlets, beef sausages, haloumi cheese, garden salad, baked local potato, assorted condiments garlic bread

'From the Sea' - American River Oysters, King George Whiting, Spencer Gulf prawns, potato salad, seasonal greens, garlic bread, Aioli and lemon

'From the Garden' - bean & smokey eggplant burgers, haloumi cheese, roasted beetroot salad, garlic skordalia, roasted dukka sweet potato with smoked yoghurt, salad greens, garlic bread

Indian feast - lamb rogan josh, tandoori chicken, lentil dahl, steamed rice, garlic naan, pappadams, yoghurt raita, chilli coriander chutney

If you are planning a self-drive exploration of Kangaroo Island, there are endless natural attractions and activities to choose from, all well documented on websites such as Tour Kangaroo Island. Below are just a few of our favourites – both close to and further afield from Cape St Albans. If you're planning a drive to the Western End of the Island, we recommend you plan ahead and pack lunch or plenty to snack on throughout the day, saving yourself for a hearty dinner in the evening.

Cape Willoughby Lighthouse and Heritage Trail

A short drive from Cape St Albans and situated in the easternmost point of Kangaroo Island, Cape Willoughby Lighthouse was the first lighthouse to be built in South Australia in 1852. It stands 27 metres high with 102 steps to the lookout tower, and offers stunning panoramic views across the Southern Ocean. Self-guided walking trails provide further insight into the lives of the early Lighthouse Keepers and the construction of the Lightstation. A 1.9km loop walk commences from the Visitors Centre.

Antechamber Bay and Lashmar Conservation Park

Antechamber Bay Beach is a 4.2km pristine stretch of white sand and crystal clear waters on the eastern coast of Kangaroo Island. Visitors can swim, snorkel or simply relax and take in the stunning scenery. It is accessible by sealed and unsealed road through Lashmar Conservation Park to the Antechamber Bay Campground.

Baudin Conservation Park

Baudin Conservation Park encompasses a mix of coastal heathlands, open woodlands, and dense mallee shrub lands creating a diverse ecosystem that supports a wide range of plant and animal species. While the primary draw of the Park is it's natural wonders, the presence of historical remnants adds an extra layer of interest and invites visitors to contemplate the rich heritage of Kangaroo Island. It's a reminder that the land we appreciate for its natural beauty has also played a vital role in human history and exploration. Hike the Ironstone Hill trail that showcases spectacular views, wildlife, and fascinating heritage stories, culminating at the historic Bates Cottage overlooking the town of Penneshaw. This hike is 4 km return, and will take about 1 hour and 30 minutes to complete.

Raptor Domain

An interactive wildlife sanctuary, Raptor Domain offers visitors the opportunity to get up close and personal with a range of birds of prey, including eagles, owls, falcons and hawks. Visitors can watch as these majestic creatures take to the skies in awe-inspiring flight demonstrations.

Seal Bay Conservation Park

A must visit attraction on Kangaroo Island, Seal Bay is a protected breeding ground for Australian sea lions, and you can observe these majestic creatures up close in their natural habitat on the white sandy beach on a guided tour. Or, set your own pace on a self-guided tour (cost applies) on the wheelchair accessible 900 metre (return) boardwalk which meanders through the dunes to a number of viewing platforms.

Kangaroo Island Outdoor Action

A popular adventure park that offers outdoor activities including quad biking and kayaking on the Harriet River. A great place to experience the thrill of the outdoors while enjoying the beautiful surroundings of Kangaroo Island.

Little Sahara Adventure Centre

Little Sahara is a naturally occurring inland dune field, approximately 4km from the coast and the tallest dune is 70 metres above sea level. Explore on foot or by sandboard (available for hire) or book an experience including buggy tours, fat bike tours and koala walking tours.

Flinders Chase National Park

Covering over 326 square kilometres of pristine wilderness, visitors can explore a range of landscapes from rugged coastline, dense bushland and encounter an abundance of wildlife including kangaroos, wallabies, echidnas, goannas and koalas. Flinders Chase is home to the iconic Remarkable Rocks and Admirals Arch, and the Cape du Couedic Road – the wavy section has become one of the most insta-famous roads in South South Australia.

Flinders Chase National Park is recovering naturally following the 2019-20 summer bushfires which burnt 96 per cent of the park. Bushfires have played an integral part in shaping the ecology of the Australian landscape for millions of years and many native plans species are adapted to survive, regenerate and thrive after fire. Much of the park has regained its green cloak of coastal health, mallee woodland and eucalyptus forest.

- Open daily, customer service staff are in the park between 9am and 5pm at Rocky River where entry fees can be paid.





Remarkable Rocks, Flinders Chase National Park

A must visit landmark if visiting the National Park, Remarkable Rocks is a cluster of what appears to be precariously balanced granite boulders. This stunning work of nature has been shaped by the erosive forces of wind, sea spray and rain over millions of years. Visitors can take in breathtaking views of the Southern Ocean and catch the waves crashing against the rocks below.

Admirals Arch, Flinders Chase National Park

Another geological wonder, Admirals Arch features a natural rock arch that has been carved out by the sea. Access the boardwalk around the cliff face to the viewing platform and watch as fur seals frolic in the waters below.
